

Faufold: Unit Meetings Outdoors - Notes for Leaders

Thank you for booking Faufold and we hope you enjoy your visit. As you will appreciate things have changed vastly over the last few months and we have had to change the way that things operate at Faufold for you and your group's safety and also for those of us who open and close the site. So here are a few pointers, requests and also advice from us. We would welcome your feedback as it is new for us too!

- The gate to Faufold is on a public footpath and so it is not possible to ensure that no one touches it whilst walking their dog, cycling etc so we are not planning to clean it, we will however open the gate before you arrive and then leave it open, we ask you to leave it open so that you don't need to touch it. We will close it up again after you have gone.

We ask that the person seeing you in be able to do that before the rest of your group arrives so please arrange to meet the person 30 minutes before your girls are due to arrive. You will be given the contact details for both the person seeing you in and out.

Please maintain at least 2 metres social distancing from the person seeing you in and out. Don't be offended if they remind you or this or ask you to step back.

- You are reminded that only leaders should park outside of the building by the kitchen doors and that all other visitors should use the car park.
- Please remind parents that they should not offer car sharing unless they are part of a support bubble. Therefore, as the car park at Faufold is relatively small you may need to stagger arrival and departure times and remind to maintain social distancing in the car park. Parents should not wander around the site or come to find your group; please ensure parents know to wait in the car park for collection of their daughter.
- At the present time we are not offering the loan equipment for visits so please ensure you have everything with you
- For evening visits of 15 or under only one of the outside toilet blocks will be used – the Booking Secretary will tell you which one it is to be, we have named the blocks to ease this process. The person seeing you in will ask you to remain outside whilst they open up the block and will also ask you if you need access to water during your visit. They will put the tap top on for you if you do. The door to the toilet block will be left open in order to minimise touching of the door handles etc and also to aid air flow within the blocks. We will supply liquid soap in the toilets but please ensure you bring paper towels or similar for the girls to dry their hands on. We have also put up notes asking users to close the toilet lid before they flush the toilet. Please operate a one in one out policy in the toilets and where possible suggest that girls use alternate toilets.
- You will need to clean the toilets and the outside water tap at the end of the session. Please use the products that we have supplied and don't put any bleach down the toilet as

Faurefold has a cesspit and bleach affects that functioning correctly. When cleaning the toilets please clean the toilet seat and lid, the flush control, the doorknobs, taps, sinks and the soap containers.

- Please remember that under the current Government guidance no singing in groups is allowed either inside or outside. This applies to campfires.
- Please take all rubbish home with you including any PPE such as masks and gloves. At present we are not having refuse collections at the site.
- Please agree with the person seeing you out a mutually agreeable time to come and do that. This should be after the rest of your group have left.
- If the person seeing you in is also seeing you out and need to remain on site they will stay at least 5 metres away from your group at all times – if this is a problem and you would prefer no one to be on-site then please let us know.
- Please report any site issues e.g. no toilet paper to the person seeing you in and out as usual.
